WHAT'S AHEAD FOR ECC?


The agenda for our January 22nd meeting will include discussions of the following items, as well as others that you wish to discuss:

Roanoke Reef: We've won a great victory! The Washington State Supreme Court ruled on December 13 that (1) they would not rehear the Roanoke Reef case, (2) the Shorelines Management Act does apply if substantial development is renewed, and a Shorelines Management permit must be obtained, and (3) Roanoke Reef must pay \$3,530.17 in costs to Eastlake Community Council, Floating Homes Assoc, and the autorney general's office.

However, the fight is not yet over! Roanoke Reef has applied for a Shorelines Management permit, and the 30 day period for comments to the Department of Community Development began Jan. 8. If a permit should be issued, requests for appeal could be made by individuals or groups for 45 days following issuance of the permit. The City Council Planning and Urban Development Committee would also have to grant variances and a conditional use permit before a building permit could be issued.

Our tasks, then, are to:

(1) Itemize points of non-compliance with the Shorelines Management Act and the Shorelines Master Plan. If you know of knowlegable people (esp. engineers, architects, environmentalists, lawyers, etc.) who could help us dissect the application or the environmental impact statement, please contact Dan Reiss(322-2961) or Mark Rasmussen (329-0228).
