

The next Eastlake Community Council Meeting will be held on Tuesday pm, January 15 at 7:30 in the Seward School faculty lunch room (2nd floor of brick building).

Victor Steinbreuck will be presenting his "famous slide show tour of Eastlake. It will be a good meeting to meet your neighbors and get to know more about your neighborhood.

ANOTHER IMPORTANT MEETING......
will be held on Thursday, Jan 24 at
the Seward School. The Eastlake
neighborhood and the Transportation
Department will meet to review the
12 proposals for the site under the
freeway at Fairview and Fuhrman.
The Transportation Dept. will hand
out a questionaire which will allow
all attendants at the meeting to rate
the proposals. These ratings will
be used by the Transportation Dept.
to evaluate public acceptance of the
various proposals.

Some of the past proposals which have been presented to the Community Council are: KOA Campground, miniwarehouses, pea patch garden, raquet ball courts and an office building. Public input is encouraged so we hope to see a good turnout at the meeting. If you have questions about the process, call Peter Erikson at 764-4165.

EASTLAKE TO FIGHT DEMOLITION

Another single-family home in our neighborhood is threatened by demolition. At the corner of E. Franklin and Lynn, just across from Anita's Grocery, developers are proposing a 7-unit apartment on the site of what is now 3 units of lower priced housing. Without adequate space for parking and access only on Lynn St., the project poses serious problems and adverse impacts on our community. It will also block upland views of Lake Union.

DEMOLITION, continued.

More importantly, this project typifies the kind of insensitive development that is leading to the destruction of both the physical and social character of our neighborhood. We need lower density, affordable . housing in Eastlake, and we need a mix of single-family homes and light density housing. Without it, Eastlake will lose that unique diversity which is the cornerstone of its liveability and enjoyability (the reason we like living here)! The Community Council is fighting against demolition permits being issued for the project. We have appealed the city's declaration of no significant impact (DNS) and will argue before the City Hearing Examiner that a comprehansive Environmental Impact Statement is required and that demolition cannot proceed.
