January--Launching the parking study will be our major priority in January. It will take several months to complete the study. We could use some volunteers. If you are interested in

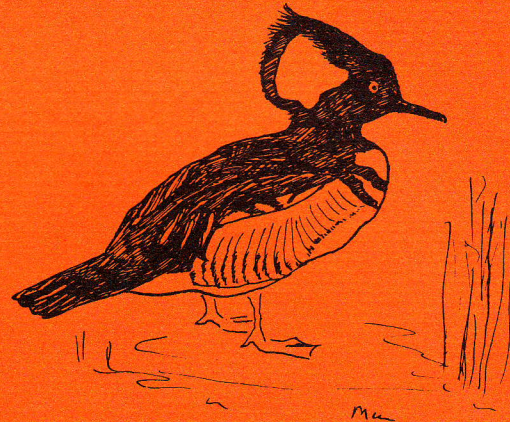

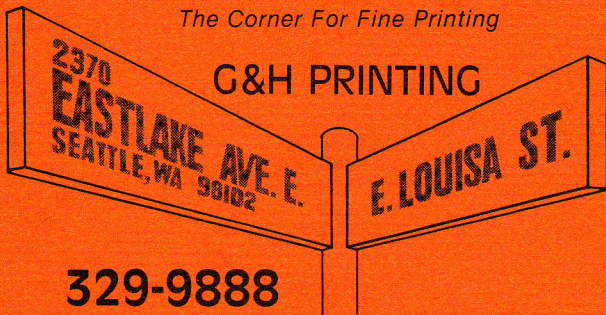
