The Fine Art of Letter Writing

The written word is Eastlake's most effective tool when dealing with City government. Decisions affecting our neighborhood may not be made in our best interest unless the decision-makers hear from us. While the E.C.C. actively corresponds with various City departments and the City Council, the real strength of Eastlake comes from individual letter writers. Any discussion at City Hall involving Eastlake issues usually begins with documenting how many letters were received from the community.

While the idea of letter writing may be exasperating to many of us (what do I say? Where do I send it? Who cares what I think anyway?), and some of us may feel overwhelmed by project numbers and acronyms, the most important thing to remember in writing is to convey how you <u>feel</u> about what is happening to your neighborhood, and how it will affect your life and your neighbor's.

To overcome our writer's block, part of our next general meeting will be spent on the art of letter writing. Our efforts will be concentrated in two areas—specific projects, and the proposed neighborhood commercial area zoning. We will have handouts for each proposed project that will explain basic info, the Eastlake position, and will include all other per—
