In 2022, violent crimes and car thefts reached a 15 year high citywide. Verified criminal shootings and shots fired incidents increased 19% compared to 2021, 69% compared to 2020, and 125% compared to 2019 data. The majority of homicide victims died from gun violence.

In 2Q 2023, the Mayor's Downtown Activation Plan was released, the Fentanyl Systems Work Group was established, KCRHA's revised 5-year plan was released, and the Community Violence Task Force was recently announced to stem the tide of gun violence.
